Hello to you all. We are trying to remember the promises of Jesus amidst the chaos "I am with you always to the end of the age" being one that we need to remind ourselves of during this turbulent time.

WEST WINDSOR HUB - Update & Appeal

West Windsor Hub is going from strength to strength, getting about 100 calls a day rising to 150 some days. However there is very little funding available and the volunteers are covering the costs of emergency food purchases, delivery and printing of flyers out of their own pockets. A grant of £250 was received from Radian Housing to cover the cost of the phone system for a while and £500 from the council has just been transfered to them but there is a need for funds going forward, as most of these recent payments are reimbursing the team for what they have already done. Thank you to those who have given - in funds or food - it is much appreciated!

Cllr Carole da Costa, from our church, is in charge of the entire operation. The volunteers manning the phone are principally from our church - headed up by David Flanagan & Carolyn Carter and including Lindsay Chetty and Sarah Bissell and with some brilliant people from the community also staffing the phones now too. They are able to do this remotely as calls to the central local help-line number are transferred to their mobile phones. There are amazing volunteers from the community and the church helping with deliveries or being Phone Friends to those who would value a regular chat to someone at this time when they may be feeling isolated if living on their own.

The phones are manned full time - the team are taking calls at the weekend and in the evenings as well. The church is only staffed by David, Carole and Carolyn from 9am - 5pm from Monday-Friday. So if you want to drop off food donations please do come during the week. Thank you! Please consider giving financially to the incredible efforts of this team to help the community.

Deliveries. We are looking for more volunteers to do **deliveries** for food or prescriptions. If you are able to help in this way and hold a current DBS let us know. There are currently around 10 volunteers (with DBS) from across the local community who are doing a great job, however, the council are drawing up a list of vulnerable people and once this is activated - demand may increase dramatically.

Food donations! We got some large donations early on - particularly from Legoland when their facilities closed down - but we're only getting a few donations of food now. Anything is welcome! Food donations can be left on the table in All Saints car park.

Phone Friend befrienders. People in the community - hopefully not at our church (see below) may be getting isolated and lonely. Especially those who live alone, if they are unable to get out, a phone call daily or every few days can make all the difference. Even if you can't leave the house this is something where you can help! Thank you to all those who have offered - we will be in touch!

Funding. If you are able to give something financially we'd be very grateful please go to...**www.gofundme.com** and type in the search 'West Windsor Hub helping the community covid 19'and the right fund-raising page will appear which you then click on to access and give. If you don't have internet or can't get it to work please email me on j.andrewgiles58@gmail.com or ring me on 07376 486023 to pledge an amount and we will collect your donation in due course

Posting information flyers through people's doors. We also have volunteers posting the Hub flyers through doors, while excercising, this is vital to increase awareness. We have covered quite a bit of the area already, but there is more to do.

Call the Hub number 01753 342110 if you need anything for yourself or for particular neighbours you may be concerned about, whether this be food, picking up medication, advice or a friendly chat. Or ring if you want to volunteer! They get all kind of calls - Adam Parsonage, one of the volunteers who many of us know and love, was called out and kindly removed a bin bag that was blocking an elderly lady's TV aerial on her roof which meant she'd lost all TV reception!

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK 30.3.20

On the morning of March 18th we awoke to a new and uncharted situation. The Archbishop of Canterbury had ordered the churches to cease meeting for worship because of the spread of the Corona virus. This was soon followed by a raft of other restrictions. Anxiety began to set in. We quickly became aware that people from all over the world were suffering too. Had God abandoned those he loved and made?

No. Not so! But it does mean that for this next period of time we must each take responsibility to continue our journey homeward towards God alone/together, as indeed the early Christian monks in our land did, hundreds of years ago. Our heavenly Father longs for his children to just come into His presence, in prayer and praise, yes, and to read His word, the Bible, yes. And to wait before him, yes, just to sit and listen to what he has to say. You could start with this verse in Isaiah 49 v 16:

See, I have inscribed you on the palms of my hands; your walls are continually before me.

And then look at Jeremiah 31 v 1 – 6, which is about the joyful return of the Jewish people when they have been in exile. It begins: At that time, says the Lord, I will be the God of all the families of Israel, and they shall be my people... I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore I have continued my faithfulness to you... Again you shall take your tambourines and go forth in the dance of the merrymakers. Again you shall plant vineyards on the mountains of Samaria; the planters shall plant and shall enjoy the fruit. This is the word of God to his people when they had been far away in exile. Our "self-isolation" is not unlike the exile referred to in this passage and although we are not Jewish ourselves, we are nonetheless God's people. In this time of "enforced distancing" I pray that you will take advantage of the time to sit with God and get to know him better.
