John 10 7-10: "So Jesus said again, 'I am telling you the truth: I am the door for the sheep....Whoever comes in by me will be saved; they will come in and go out and find pasture...I have come in order that you might have life-life in abundance'

We learnt in our bible study on Tuesday that in Jesus' time simple hillside sheep-folds were used at night in the summer, unlike the winter sheep-fold buildings in villages. A summer sheep fold was just a fenced in area, with a gap in the fence. The shepherd lay and slept across the gap so no sheep could leave and no wolf could enter. The Master of the Universe is our protecting door and we can live a life in absolute safety and security. Trust, satisfaction and contentment in Jesus give us vitality, energy and enjoyment of life.





## **Report on Our Mission and Vision Conference**

This report is a summary of the comments and conclusions of the small group discussions and plenary session of the conference.

Our previous two vicars encouraged diversity and spirituality, so we have some people in our church family who love the traditional style of worship, while others prefer more modern up-beat services. At All Saints' Dedworth, both are valued and there are many people who are happy to

worship in either style. In fact we offer as many styles of worship as possible within our available resources and God given talents. Most Sundays in the year we offer two morning services, giving the church family the chance to choose. On some occasions we come together for a joint service in which we try to cater for all. Our church is the people, rather than the bricks and mortar of the building, and we take ownership of our worship. A new vicar will need to be genuinely comfortable with traditional and new styles of worship.

For special services such as at Christmas and Easter the congregations join together to celebrate as one big family. Christingle services are great favourites as the church, in the darkness of a winter night, is filled with flickering candle – light and we are joined by many friends from the wider community. Baptisms are important too. New people are always welcome to join our services at any time. When we welcome our visitors into God's family, they are impressed by our sense of closeness and family.

A church member has described us as a "church characterised by a core of incredible servants to the church family". For the last two years, during our two interregnums and our Covid 19 experience, we have worked in teams, taking specific responsibilities for the life of our church. We hope our new vicar will be prepared to acknowledge these when they take over. One of the leaders wrote: "At ASD we work as a unified team. Finding friendship and companionship at church makes you feel comfortable about yourself and where you fit in." We are an entrepreneurial church prepared to take a novel and fresh approach to any situation and proactive in taking initiatives. We have a heart for everyone, whether they are new or whether we see them every day.

It would be nice to nurture our own talents and share tasks with a wider pool of people. The lasting effects of the pandemic will mean that more people will need hope and faith. As an established community hub, we will need to look outwards even more. ASD could become a beacon for many who may have lost jobs and purpose in life. Our YouTube ministry, developed in response to the Covid

crisis, and our active presence on other social media platforms makes us widely accessible to those who need us and will help expand our congregation .

We have financial challenges but fundraise to overcome them. As we grow, we would enjoy increased dialogue with other churches and to become part of a great network of churches sharing each other's strengths across the diocese.

#### A selection of the shorter comments from the conference.

- We helped on the homeless project, looking after those who could not look after themselves.
- Our church is outward looking. We enjoyed being on the Praise Bus and the services we did in the Park and on Windsor racecourse.
- We need a vicar that has a sense of fun and can adapt.
- The holiday clubs we organise are great. It's a shame that we will not be able to do them this year because of Covid 19.
- Special services attract a wider number of people into the church e.g. Pets' Service, Flower Services and Christingles.
- We need to think about giving the young people more responsibility.
- Our church has a youthful approach.
- We would like a vicar who will get to speak to and know everyone personally, not just the leaders. Is that possible?
- In 3 years' time we will see the churches in Dedworth working together more.
- In 3 years' time we will have a revival.
- In 3 years time our financial position will be more stable. Stewardship is about more than money it also includes skills and items for loan.
- It is good to have lots of services on offer for those of us who work irregular hours.
- One of the things we need is to go back to a seasonal approach with maybe a spiritual course one season, a social event in another and have a vicar with the confidence to shut things down and start things up for a short period. And then reflect.
- A young person said, "Young people keep coming and are really enthusiastic. We have a congregation that care about each other."
- In 3 years time there will be more young families bringing more children. We will be giving youth more responsibilities, and continuing the work with schools and having closer links.

# Vicar Recruitment: The conference is over. What happens next?



Our editing team for the Parish Profile is Jackie Wiggins, Ruth Norris, John Sturgeon and Carolyn Carter - chosen by the PCC, please pray for them. They are now hard at work incorporating the results of the conference and questionnaires, along with a summary of what we have done during the Covid crisis, into our existing Parish Profile. Once this is done it will be available for viewing. The final version must be approved by Rhodri Bowen who led our Mission and Vision day.

When the profile is nearing completion, we will hold a "Section 11" meeting, where the PCC chooses who will be our two representatives on the appointment and interviewing panel. Their job will be to sift candidates and interview them later in the process.

Once this is complete, we arrange a "Section 12" meeting where a representative of our Bishop, probably Father Richard Lamey, Assistant Archdeacon, joins the PCC. At this meeting we agree the final version of the parish profile and the recruitment and advertising strategy. We start advertising shortly afterwards. Lots of prayer needed please!
