Jesus breaks all of the rules Luke 6: 6-11: Faced in the synagogue by a man with a withered hand, Jesus said to the Pharisees, "...What does our Law allow us to do on the Sabath? To help or to harm? To save someone's life or destroy it?" Jesus told the man to stretch out his hand and healed it. In that moment, Jesus showed the religious people that helping someone in need trumps following the rules. Jesus transformed that man's life. Forever, he will have remembered that Sabbath as the day Jesus healed His hand and healed his heart.

In Matthew 8:1-4, "(A leper).... knelt before Him and said, " Lord, if you choose, you can make me clean." Jesus stretched out His hand and touched him saying, "I do choose. Be made clean." and immediately his leprosy was healed". Jesus should have stayed six feet clear of him, to remain uninfected (sound familiar?) but instead he touched him. He thus rendered himself unclean. Again he was more interested in faith and people than in following the rules.

We have to decide, as Christians, in this time of great need whether to follow the "rules" and only help those we like or are close to, or whether to stretch out our hand, as Jesus did and "touch" (virtually) all those we meet who need His love.

Community Groups in September/October

Under the recent Covid regulations the meeting of groups for educating children up to 18 is permissible, as are group formally organised to provide mutual aid, therapy or any other form of support including bereavement and addiction. Hence, Men's Matters will meet on Monday, 28th September, as will the Dancing Class for children. Mini Maestros will meet on Friday, 2nd October and SANDS (bereavement support) and Friends and Family (support for families), will be allowed to meet once their risk assessments are in place.

Formal or informal clubs with a social rather than a support function, such as hobby clubs, book clubs, choirs and veteran's associations are not allowed to meet.

Break-ins at Church

Unfortunately we have had two burglaries in the last two weeks. Despite the addition of many new security measures after the first incident, the café door was forced out of its frame and has now been boarded up. The perpretrator has taken the café TV, a computer monitor, a laptop, microphones and other electronic devices. We are endeavouring to claim on our insurance, but there is a substantial excess sum. With repair costs, the high costs of some of the equipment and the need to invest in more heavy duty security equipment we will be facing significant financial cost and losses.

The church is undamaged and the response from church members has been impressive. It shows a silver lining in a sad, dark and heavy cloud.

Raising Awareness of Domestic Abuse

On 27th October, there was to have been a 'Raising Awareness of Domestic Abuse' event at our church. Due to Covid 19 restrictions this has been cancelled. The pressures of Covid 19 restrictions have caused an unprecedented increase in the occurrence of Domestic Abuse and Safeguarding Officers throughout the Oxford Diocese, were requested to attend a Zoom webinar in order that they may alert congregations how best to cope with this issue.

What is Domestic Abuse? The Government defines domestic abuse as: 'Any incident or pattern of incidents of controlling, coercive or threatening behaviour, violence or abuse between those aged 16 or over, who are or have been intimate partners or family members, regardless of gender or sexuality.'

Some Facts

- Abuse may be psychological, physical, sexual, financial or emotional.
- Anybody can be affected by domestic abuse, regardless of age, social background, gender, religion, sexuality
 or ethnicity.
- Domestic abuse affects people in all settings in our families, in our congregations, in our places of work and in our neighbourhoods.
- Children and young people can be damaged by the abuse that they see in their families.
- Statistics show that women are most affected, but men may also experience domestic abuse
- Women are more likely to experience *coercive control* than men.

It can be difficult to recognise that someone is suffering from domestic abuse

- Victims of abuse become very skilled at hiding what is happening to them owing to fear, shame and the desire to protect themselves and their children.
- Some victims of abuse do not realise they are suffering abuse, because they believe that abuse is only
 physical or sexual.

Tell Tale Signs

Warning signs of domestic abuse include instances of coercive control, in which one partner seeks power and control over the other.

- A woman may never be seen alone; her partner always accompanies her.
- She may gradually become isolated, possibly moving to a new house, a long way from family.
- She may not have friends, or may gradually stop seeing them she may withdraw from church and other groups
- Her partner may talk over her or for her and she may be reluctant to speak.
- Her partner may appear controlling or may regularly make disparaging comments about her.
- She may have unexplained injuries. However, physical injuries are frequently concealed by clothing.
- When approached about any injuries, she may make excuses about how they happened
- If her partner behaves inappropriately in public, she may justify and excuse his behaviour
- She may have no access to money
- She may have regular unexplained absences from work or often be late for work.
- Her partner may tell people she is abusing him and that he is a victim of domestic abuse.
- Her partner may be unsociable with her friends, family and colleagues, **or** he may be extremely friendly to everyone.
- If she has children, she may find it difficult to control them and they may call her names and ignore her **or** her children may be extremely clingy and not want to leave her.
- She may not want people to visit her at home or may not be comfortable giving out her address or contact details.

What can you do to help?

If you have concerns about someone you know, do not ignore what you may have observed, but talk to one of the Safeguarding Team. Without proper training and experience in this field, **we can do more harm than good**. Churches do not often have the necessary expertise available to intervene, but should make it known that they do not condone coercive controlling behaviour of any sort, will report to statutory authorities and support victims and help them seek professional care. In emergencies, the police or social services should be informed.

Sadly, victims with Christian beliefs are reluctant to speak out about their domestic abuse. They can be reluctant about (and sometimes dissuaded from) approaching secular organisations that they feel do not understand Christian teaching on relationships. At the same time, they do not feel they can approach their own church. This could be because of the silence, shame and stigma surrounding their situation, or because their abusive partner may be part of the leadership or congregation. 'Restored' (www.Restoredrelationships.org) is a global alliance of organisations and churches which promotes a Christian response to domestic abuse. Christians believe that faith in Christ is about serving the God of love. Christian belief is about following Jesus Christ, who honoured and respected both men and women and resisted violence. Christians are called to live in a way that reflects this belief. Our relationships are meant to reflect God's love. We understand that God's desire for those affected by domestic violence – both victims and abusers – is healing and wholeness. 'Follow God's example, therefore, as dearly loved children and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.' — Ephesians 5:1
