Judges 16:28,30 *'Sampson prayed..'Please God, strengthen me just once more ..and let me die with the Philistines'* Then he pushed with all his might and down came the temple on the rulers and the people in it.

Some of the great figures of the Old Testament were highly imperfect characters. Sampson killed many and was a weak womaniser. David showed a terrible weakness by sending Uriah out to die in battle because of his lust for Bathsheba (2 Samuel 11:14). Both Adam and Isaac passed off their wives as their sisters out of weakness.

We are all acutely aware of our own failings and many are probably feeling a bit weak and timid after this long year of suffering. But we can have confidence. Despite our many failings God can use us. Even if we've totally messed up a situation or a relationship, God can transform the situation and stay by our side if we keep our faith. He can also forgive our past sins and set us on the right track. We can return to being a great warrior for Him. It's never too late for God to help us and no-one is hopeless. However small our corner is, with God's help we can shine our light and change things for the good!

HOW THE DECISION MADE WAS MADE



Wednesday, 10th March. “Getting to know us Day”.

The 3 candidates were invited to meet 4 church groups by Zoom. Each group focused on an area of church life: Worship & Mission, Children, Youth & Schools, Prayer & Pastoral Care and Enabling. It was an opportunity for the candidates to introduce themselves and to ask questions about areas of church life at All Saints’ to gain a deeper understanding of our church, as they continued to discern God’s path for them.

The feedback they gave about this opportunity was that it was very valuable. All candidates asked that their thanks be passed to those who gave their time to be involved in these meetings. This way of working was very different to other recruitment procedures and was commended by the candidates. The candidates also were very complimentary about John Sturgeon’s series of videos of the church and the Dedworth community which had been sent to them in advance of the interviews.

Thursday March 11th Interview by Zoom Day

The three candidates had been asked to prepare a short 5minute sermon on Eph. 2.1-10. The candidate’s sermons were live streamed by John Sturgeon to a private link on our YouTube channel, and feedback and comments were requested from the congregation to be sent to Andrew Giles by 3:00pm so that the panel could take the votes, comments and feedback into account.



Votes on the sermons were returned by 34 people. Rev. Paul Walker had most votes. There were many insightful comments passed anonymously to the interviewing panel of Archdeacon Stephen Pullin, Area Dean Ainsley Swift, John Sturgeon and Paul Watkins. The overwhelming feedback was about the extremely high quality of all three sermons and delight at being asked to vote. We thank the other two candidates for their hard work in preparing their sermons.



The rest of the day: The candidates gave a 10-minute presentation to the interview panel, on **‘What are the most pressing questions for the parish church which arise from the experience of Covid? How do you help equip the congregation for post lockdown mission and ministry?’**

The panel then took the rest of the time to interview the candidates in turn. They scored each candidate and fed back on the suitability ensuring that the process was fair and documented. Following discussions, it was decided to offer the job to **Rev Paul Walker**.

If all goes well, we are hoping to see Paul in the parish during July and will let you know his installation date.

Stations of the Cross

To remember Holy Week, Rev. Rosie Webb at St Andrew's has organised the 14 Windsor churches comprising 'Churches Together in Windsor' to present '14 Stations of the Cross', one for each church. We will have one station in our church garden and Windsor Christians are encouraged to walk to every Church and read and reflect on each one. Our station in number 11.

11: Jesus is Nailed to The Cross

We Remember the Cross of Jesus:
Huge iron nails are hammered through his wrists and through his ankles. Iron through human flesh, the flesh must yield, there is no defence. Jesus, nailed to the cross, cannot move. The hand that has wiped blindness from the eyes; the hand that opened the seal of deafness, the hand that touched a heart and cured a leper, the hand that blessed children and those with a disability; the carpenter's hand is joined to the wood again. As the cross is put in place, he hangs there between us and God, a blood stained victim for love.



Response: We adore you O Christ, and we praise you, because by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world.

We Name the Crosses of Today:

Jesus continues to be crucified in the children who die every minute of hunger in our world. He is crucified in all who are maimed, damaged and displaced because of war. He is crucified in all who are marginalised in our society because of their race, sexuality or gender. He is crucified in those who are abused physically, sexually or emotionally. He is crucified in those who are trafficked across the world. He is crucified in the exploitation of the earth and its resources.

We Pray:

Jesus, we pray on behalf of those who cannot reach out to you at this moment. We pray for all victims of violence; those who suffer it and those who inflict it. We pray especially for children, for the elderly and those too vulnerable to defend themselves. May victims of cruelty and oppression know that you are always with them.

recorded clients on Volo. Some of these may have only used the service once, others are regular users. Some of the regulars we know well from their shopping list or know which days they normally put a request in. If we don't hear from them, we will do a welfare check and if needed, refer them to other care agencies.

During the 40+ weeks of operation from establishment to 27th December 2020, the Hub and its volunteers actioned nearly 6,500 tasks, serving residents in Windsor in need of support. This is phenomenal and testament to the community spirit that exists in Windsor between residents, local businesses and one another.

The Future

We continue to work with other community group and the community embedment project, with the aim of providing the kind of support that will help sustain our community. The work we have been doing with the snack packs is a great fit with the work done by Abri in other areas with their "Good Grub Club". Job clubs, CV writing and supporting people to become work ready are all areas that the hub could become involved in as the community recovers from CV19 and moves towards sustainability. We have met online with Kerith Community Church to look at ways of working together on future projects including one with Christians Against Poverty (CAP), a national charitable organisation specialising in debt counselling.

We currently operate with a small core of 16 committed and capable volunteers who undertake the tasks of call taking, shopping, delivering and hub working. All the current volunteers are DBS checked.
