**Luke 6:32a, 35 -37a** *If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you?... But love your enemies, do good and lend, expecting nothing in return. God calls us to show them the same mercy and grace if they are having a bad day as we would hope they would show us. Mercy and grace that, first and foremost, God has shown us in Jesus.



## Service of Collation, Induction and Installation of Rev. Paul Walker Thursday July 15<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm



Rev Paul Walker was duly collated, inducted and installed on Thursday July 15<sup>th</sup> and is now 100% our vicar!

Thank you to all who joined us online or in person for this joyous occasion. We were greatly saddened that the COVID restrictions meant only a few could attend on site, though are overjoyed that to date over 200 computers have viewed the service. One was played to a Church congregation with 70 members attending! The affect of COVID struck in other ways—Paul's middle daughter Harriet was pinged beforehand and only Charlotte was able to accompany him at the service! But it was a time of great celebration!



Archdeacon Stephen Pullin urged us to “comfort the afflicted” and “afflict the comfortable” in his address. Bishop Olivia and Archdeacon Stephen carried out the procedures for collation, induction and installation. The churchwardens handed a set of keys to Paul, before the Archdeacon installed him in his seat, telling him to pray and lead people in worship and service and to encourage them in their witness of Jesus, in the power of the Holy Spirit.

**Changes to Services for August**

For now, finite resources mean we have no online provision and both our Sunday gatherings will be in the building. A sub-committee of the PCC will be in regular discussion about taking things forward, including how to continue our online presence/livestreaming etc. Please pray about this and let us know if you feel called to help in any way from the Autumn onwards.



**From this week (1<sup>st</sup> August) the 9:30 Communion Service will start at 9:15am and the 10:45am Family Service will begin at 11:00 am!!**



We are changing the time to remain COVID safe. We need to clean and reorganise the site between our worship gatherings, so that the later service can take place indoors if needed. While we will be **observing group distancing of 1.5m** and asking people to **wear masks for now, we will be able to sing as we worship together** for at least some of the songs or hymns!

A group will be frequently reviewing the local and national situations, making adjustments as we go forwards and we may change the configuration of our worship space at some point so that the communion table is on the back platform, to fit more people in.

To date, we've had five services in a row without rain and the plan is to continue outside, with an informal format for as long as we can, possibly to the end of September, depending on the weather and infection rate. Wherever we are, we will continue to sing some well-known songs, have some time to receive from God as we share family news, read God's word and spend some time in prayer. We know that some of the church family are excited to come back, and some are still hesitant, but it feels right to try meeting in person and we hope you will feel able to come along too.

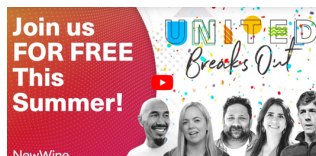

## Golf taking off at Wexham Park!

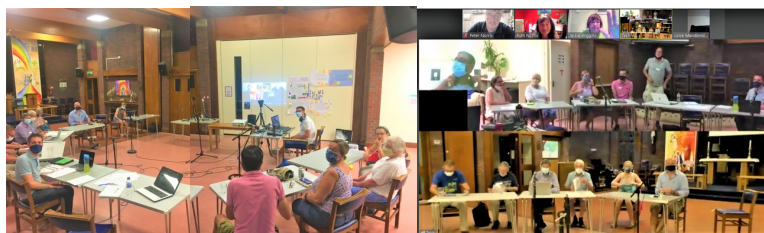

There is a continued demand for Free Food Parcels and FoodShare Referrals and Vouchers, while demand for delivery services, unsurprisingly, has fallen, now that Covid restrictions have been lifted. The team help with all sorts of problems, large and small.

### **Combating Holiday Hunger for Children**

Together with other local charities in the 'Food Network', WWH has been in negotiation with 'Achieving for Children', a social enterprise company formed by the coalition of RBWM, Kingston and Richmond Education Authorities and Social Services to provide services for children in those boroughs. The discussions have centred around the Government's initiative to combat 'Holiday Hunger'.

In Windsor and Maidenhead, the local project is called 'Fuel'. The plan is to provide activities for needy children and teenagers during the school summer holidays and to supplement their provision of food. The activities will take place at 'Family Hubs' at The Manor Children's Centre, Hanover Way and The Youth and Community Centre, Alma Road.

WWH plan to provide 'Snack Pack' meals and the ingredients for 'Family Cooking Activity' packs to promote healthy eating. It is also hoped to provide videos to accompany each recipe showing the method of cooking. These would be available on Facebook which could be accessed by phone or at the Centre.
